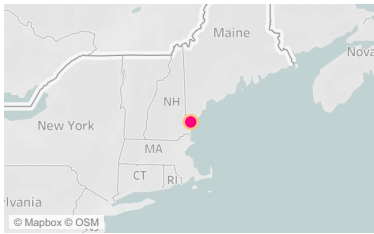

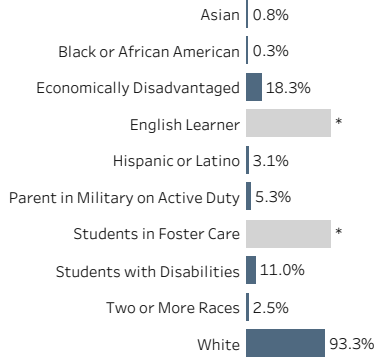

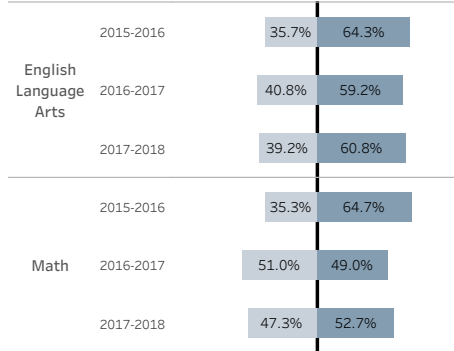
Chronic Absenteeism



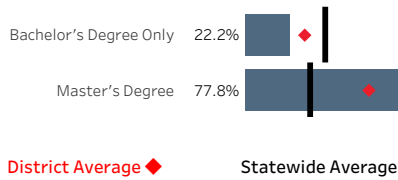

Academic Offerings
